

President's Greeting

Over the last decade there has been increasing competition between sports to attract money and recruits. As a result, we, like the leaders of every sport, have realized that if orienteering is to continue to survive and prosper, we have to make changes that make it more attractive to the media. This particularly affects the elite events which form the basis of any TV coverage. It also means that orienteering in all its aspects has to offer a professional image. Everything, from a publication produced by the IOF Secretariat down to the smallest local event, has to be attractive, accessible, well put together, and good value for money. To achieve this, IOF has made a lot of changes in the past 8 years:

We have made big changes to the elite events programme to enable a higher media profile.

We have showcased orienteering in the programme the World Games and the World Masters Games.

We have exchanged our traditional subscription magazine for an electronic O-Zine plus a good looking PR publication.

We have reorganised our committee structure with the aim of greater focus and efficiency.

We have introduced the new disciplines of Trail Orienteering and Mountain Bike Orienteering, and a Sprint format at the World Foot Orienteering Championships.

Now the time has come to draw breath and consolidate. We need to consolidate our new event programme. We need to stabilise the IOF struc-



ture and financial position. We need to reinforce our position on the international sport stage of multi-sport games and organisations. We need to fine-tune our organisation and our event programme so that we start to get the benefit of the changes we have made.

This consolidation is reflected in the Activity Plan your Council proposes. It builds largely on that of the previous Congress period, and seeks to reinforce the progress we have made in the last two years. This progress has been the result of dedicated work by hundreds of convinced and committed people all over the orienteering world. Thank you all for the time, effort and creativity you put in to make sure our sport remains both a wonderful recreation for all and a superb test of athleticism for the top elite of the world.

Council's Report

The present Council, elected at the 2000 General Assembly for the period 2000-2002, held its first meeting at the Congress venue in Leibnitz, Austria, on 5 August 2000. Since then, Council has convened eight times during the Congress period. The meetings have been held in Paris, France; Tampere, Finland; Helsinki, Finland (5 meetings), and Ury, France. In addition, Council has also held two meetings by means of electronic communication. The decisions taken by e-mail have been noted in, and regarded as part of, the minutes of the following Council meeting.

The President, the Senior Vice President and the two Vice Presidents have constituted the President's Working Group (PWG).

The XX IOF General Assembly held in Leibnitz, Austria, in August 2000, took a number of far-reaching decisions in relation to the future route of orienteering. Three main objectives for the Congress period 2001-2002 were defined, namely the positioning of orienteering for inclusion in the Olympic Games and other important multi-sport games, the development of the total quality of major IOF events, and increased visibility for the sport.

In line with the defined overall objectives, the General Assembly endorsed Council's strategy paper 'IOF Elite Events - a concept for development', and adopted the so-called Leibnitz Convention on media and spectator friendly events. The General Assembly also decided that a world championship in sprint orienteering be introduced and that, if technically possible, it should start in 2001.

Effective utilisation of scarce resources

In order to realise the endorsed ambitious activity plan, Council has taken a number of measures aimed at enhancing the organisation and at utilising the scarce resources as effectively as possible.

In the beginning of 2000, Council adopted a new management model, in which the Senior Vice President is responsible for managing internal activities and the President takes care of external relations. This model has enabled the IOF to further develop its external profile whilst securing a dynamic internal management.

The need to create multi-disciplinary teams of expertise for various tasks of a temporary character has become more and more frequent. Because of this, it is important that available

expertise can be used in a flexible way, depending on the needs of the disciplines.

It was determined to continue the four discipline committees as the core units of the organisation. Under Council, each committee has the overall responsibility for the implementation of all activities related to its respective discipline. Specialist commissions were established to create a resource pool for the discipline committees and for Council. The third platform consists of the working groups which are formed to carry out specific tasks. The new structure became effective in October 2000.

Towards a new elite events programme


Following the General Assembly decisions in relation to the elite events programme, Council appointed a temporary working group, the Elite Events Programme (EEP) panel and asked this group to develop a proposal for a layered base events programme, a definition of the discipline formats, a programme for the World Orienteering Championships and the World Cup, and a media friendly event concept. After wide consultation with member federations, athletes, organisers and other internal and external groups, the EEP presented its final report to Council in May 2001.

On the basis of the EEP report, Council prepared four proposals to be presented to the national federations for decision-making. In order not to delay the development process by having to wait for a decision at the 2002 General Assembly, Council decided to call an Extraordinary General Assembly to be held in conjunction with the 2001 World Orienteering Championships.

On 3 August 2001, the Extraordinary General Assembly approved Council's proposals that World Championships and World Cups in foot orienteering be run annually, and that the discipline formats be sprint, middle, long and relay. It was decided to introduce the new event calendar from the year 2004 onwards, and Council was delegated to appoint the organiser of the World Orienteering Championships in 2004. As a result of the obvious need to look further into the complex issue of creating a new qualification procedure for the World Championships, Council decided to withdraw its fourth proposal.

Sweden to organise the 2004 WOC

To secure the implementation of the Extraordinary General Assembly decisions, Council deemed it necessary to divide the foot orienteering related work between two separate



groups, allowing both of them to focus on the main issues.

The Elite Events Group (EEG) was made responsible for World Orienteering Championships, World Cup and World Games, whilst the Foot Orienteering Committee (FOC) was given responsibility for the development of the Junior World Orienteering Championships, World Masters Orienteering Championships, World Ranking Events, the world ranking list, and regional events. The determined division of tasks is based on the need to put focus not only on senior elite activities, but also on junior and masters activities and the regional issue, and on the belief that a holistic approach is the only route to ensure the overall quality of an event.

Immediately after the Extraordinary General Assembly, federations were invited to submit applications to organise the 2004 World Orienteering Championships (WOC). Two bids were received, namely from Sweden and Ukraine. After a careful analysis of the bids, Council appointed Sweden organiser of the championships, and the organiser's agreement was signed on 31 October 2001.

Orienteering and the Olympic Movement

The IOF is a member of GAISF (General Association of International Sports Federations), ARISF (Association of IOC Recognized International Sports Federations), IWGA (International World Games Association), IMGA (International Masters Games Association), and a recognized federation of the IOC (International Olympic Committee).

In October 2000, a Memorandum of Understanding between the IOC and the IWGA

was signed. According to this memorandum, the IOC agreed to grant its patronage to the World Games. The inclusion of the World Games as a major official part of the Olympic structure means that this multi-sport event has become a very important stepping stone towards the Olympics.

In order to reach its goal of getting all orienteering disciplines into the Olympics, the IOF has been working towards fulfilment of the formal criteria, in particular with respect to the number of member federations. Since the 2000 IOF Congress, three new countries, namely Indonesia, Turkey, and Thailand, have been admitted by Council as provisional associate members. Their membership will be proposed for ratification at the 2002 IOF Ordinary General Assembly.

As of 30 April 2002, the IOF has 61 member countries of which 42 are full, and 19 associate members. In the light of the current situation, the original target of 75 members by the end of 2002 was too ambitious and 3-4 more years would seem to be required to achieve this goal.

Because of foot orienteering not yet fulfilling the formal admission criteria, the IOF has not submitted to the International Olympic Committee (IOC) any application for inclusion in the programme of the 2008 Olympic Summer Games to be held in Beijing, China.

During the past Congress period, the IOF has taken measures aimed at promoting the application for ski orienteering to be admitted onto the programme of the 2006 Olympic Winter Games in Turin, Italy. The IOF has concentrated its efforts on approaching the IOC and the international Olympic winter federations, whilst the national federations have been encouraged to approach

their respective national Olympic Committees and IOC members. According to current information, the decision on the 2006 Games programme is likely to be taken by September 2002.

With the aim of raising the profile of orienteering and the IOF in international sports circles, the IOF has systematically sought opportunities to have people elected to key positions in sports organisations within the Olympic Movement. At the 2001 Annual Meeting of IWGA, the IOF President Sue Harvey was elected member of the IWGA Executive Committee. She also is a member of the IMGA Board of Governors.

IOF representatives have participated in international conferences and seminars, such as the GAISF Congress and General Assembly, the IOC Sport for All Congress, the IOC World Conference on Sport and the Environment, and in meetings of the IWGA, the IMGA, and the ASOIF (Association of Summer Olympic International Federations).

The IOF was offered the opportunity to make a presentation on orienteering and the environment at the IOC World Conference on Sport and the Environment held in Nagano, Japan, in November 2001. The IOF was represented by Brian Parker, the chairman of the Environment Commission, who delivered a presentation entitled 'Orienteering - the Environmental Sport'. As a follow-up to the Conference, the IOC Environment Commission has asked for permission to include the presentation in its environmental journal.

The IOF has asked the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) to include orienteering in their out-of-competition testing programme, and a written agreement to this effect is expected to be concluded by the end of May 2002.

World Games participation - an important step

Orienteering made its debut in world-wide elite multi-sport Games when it featured on the pro-

gramme of the 8th World Games in Akita, Japan, in August 2001. For the first time ever, orienteering had the opportunity to benefit from the media attention generated by this high-level event organised under the patronage of the IOC.

The debut of orienteering was successful, and 77 athletes from 19 countries had the possibility to attend the spectacular opening ceremony and to participate in the events: an individual middle distance competition for both women and men, and a mixed-team relay. Grant Bluett, Australia, and Hanne Staff, Norway, became the first ever orienteers to win a World Games gold medal. In the relay, Norway won the close competition with Lithuania in second and Sweden in third place.


Following its successful debut in this major multi-sport event, orienteering has been invited to participate in the next World Games to be held in Duisburg, Germany, in 2005.

In October 2002, orienteering will be on the programme of yet another major multi-sports event. For the first time ever, the World Masters Orienteering Championships (WMOC) will be incorporated with the World Masters Games. The Games will be organised in Melbourne, Australia, and orienteering is expected to be among the three biggest sports on the programme.

SportUp hired to market orienteering

In late 2000, the IOF experienced two setbacks affecting its finances. In October, the Internet partner Worldsport Networks Ltd. was liquidated, and in November Suunto communicated that it would no longer renew the sponsorship agreement for 2001. The loss of these two contracts meant a yearly decrease of income of approx. 65,000 EUR. Because of the loss of income, and in order to achieve the budgeted result, Council made substantial cost cuts to the 2001 budget. Since 1997, the IOF had received a yearly grant of

50,000 EUR from the Finnish Ministry of Education. According to its original decision to appropriate these funds for a period of five years, the Ministry did not approve the IOF's grant application for 2002. In February 2002, the IOF had to experience yet another financial setback, when Finnair informed the IOF that it would no longer continue its sponsorship for 2002.

With the aim of finding new commercial partners, the IOF has entered into a partnership contract with a professional sports marketing company, Sport Up Finland Ltd. The company specialises in sports marketing at both national and international level. The R&D process and the work on developing the marketing concept were finalised by the end of 2001, and the marketing activities commenced in January 2002. The full benefit of the partnership will only be realised after one or two years.

O-zine new tool for communication

Since 1999, the Orienteering World magazine has been used as a PR tool with the aim of raising the profile of the sport in the international sports world. In 2000, two separate issues of the magazine were published, one of which was devoted to environmental matters, and the other to the equality aspects of orienteering. The main theme of the 2001 double issue was 'Orienteering and multi-sport Games', including an extensive coverage of the Akita World Games. The PR style magazine has been well received and has proved to be a good vehicle for delivering the message of orienteering to external target groups.

The first issue of the new electronic newsletter O-zine was launched in March 2001. O-zine is meant to be a new tool for communication with all members of the international orienteering family. The newsletter is published on the IOF Internet home page 4-6 times per year.

As a result of the liquidation of Worldsport Networks Ltd. in autumn 2000, the work on the IOF Internet strategy was delayed. Meanwhile, it was decided to continue to update and slightly revise the existing site at www.orienteering.org. The site is maintained by Ray Barnes of Vegan Idealistic Programmers, who also stepped in as the new host of the IOF World Ranking List from the beginning of 2001, when N3Sport withdrew after three years' support.

In late autumn 2001, Digital Sports Network (DSN) was appointed official Internet/media partner of GAISF. With the aim of evaluating the benefits of joining other international sports federations under the GAISF umbrella, Council decided to

enter into negotiations with DSN regarding the terms of the proposed agreement. Depending on the outcome of these negotiations, the IOF Internet strategy will be based either on the GAISF multi-sport website or on a stand-alone site.

Innovations at WOC 2001

In addition to organising the first ever world championships sprint orienteering event, the organisers of the 2001 World Orienteering Championships in Tampere, Finland, introduced several features which added considerable value to the event. The secrets of orienteering were revealed to the public in a way that had never been seen before.

Extensive TV coverage combined with a large screen at the competition centre offered the spectators the possibility to follow the progress of the race through live pictures from the forest. For the first time ever, GPS Global Positioning System was introduced in an orienteering competition. The tracking system provided the opportunity to show a piece of the map to the audience, and the spectators could follow a particular orienteer's route choice on the map. The experiment of using GPS in the classic distance race was successful, with the audience experiencing glimpses of it.

World Championships and World Cup events

During the Congress period, the following World Championships and World Cup events have been organised:


2000: World Cup in Orienteering (JPN, AUS, UKR, FIN, POR), Junior World Orienteering Championships (CZE), World Cup in Trail Orienteering (UKR).

2001: World Cup in Ski Orienteering (BUL, SWE, FIN, RUS), Junior World Ski Orienteering Championships (ITA), World Masters Ski Orienteering Championships (ITA), World Orienteering Championships (FIN), Junior World Orienteering Championships (HUN), World Masters Orienteering Championships (LTU). World Cup in MTB Orienteering (FIN, AUT, CZE, FRA), World Cup in Trail Orienteering (FIN). Additionally, orienteering was included in the programme of the World Games (JPN).

2002: World Ski Orienteering Championships (BUL), Junior World Ski Orienteering Championships (CZE), World Masters Ski Orienteering Championships (CZE).

The reports from these events have been submitted to the IOF in accordance with the relevant competition rules.

Foot orienteering: event quality assurance

A major part of the work of the Foot Orienteering Committee has been devoted to ensuring that the principles of the Leibnitz convention are implemented at future elite events, in particular at World Championships (WOC) and World Cup events. The committee has established close co-operation with the IT Commission with the aim of ensuring good internet coverage of the World Cup in 2002.

The role of the IOF Controllers (now Event Advisors) has been changed in the direction of event advising. The intention is to use the national advisors for traditional "controlling" in the forest so that the IOF Event Advisor can concentrate more on other aspects of the event, such as, for example, the arena and media issues. The first steps aimed at educating a special group of high-level advisors, Senior Event Advisors, for tasks related to WOC and World Cup events have already been taken.

After some initial difficulties and technical adjustments to the World Ranking Events scheme and to the World Ranking List, both now function very well and the number of ranking events has increased from 68 in 2000 to 87 in 2002.

The Junior World Orienteering Championships (JWOC) in Hungary were very well organised. The courses were good and, due to the chosen accommodation centre, the social atmosphere of the event was clearly evident. The time and programme of future JWOCs is being determined, and the team leader meeting held during the JWOC week serves as a good debating forum for the coaches.

The Portuguese Orienteering Federation hosted a good World Cup final round in October 2000, in particular, the races in the Marinha Grande area.

The organiser of the 2001 WOC had certainly appreciated the need for orienteering to be visible in order to attract more sponsors and spectators. The organisers staged the best international elite event ever and the 2001 WOC will serve as a good example for future organisers, in particular from the point of view of attracting more people into orienteering, both at the national and international level.

MTB Orienteering: technical development

During the past Congress period, the MTB Orienteering Committee has convened five times. The meetings have been held in Palma de Mallorca, Spain; Tampere, Finland; Veszprem, Hungary; Vaucluse, France, and Rome, Italy. Due to the MTB orienteering discipline still being in its infancy, the committee has largely been focussing on development aspects in relation to rules and regulations, discipline formats, the international calendar, and the education of IOF Controllers with a view to securing the quality of future world events.

The work on the first edition of the Competition Rules for IOF MTB Orienteering events was finalised, and the rules came into effect in January 2001.

The 2000 World Cup programme was made up of events in five countries, i.e. Czech Republic, Belgium, France, Hungary and Slovakia. All of the organisers staged excellent events although the number of participants was still too low for the competitions to be financially sound.

The 2001 World Cup series included three rounds in four countries. The first round was held in conjunction with the World Orienteering Championships in Tampere, Finland, the second round was organised in Austria and Hungary. The final World Cup round was hosted by France. In conjunction with this event, the first ever Clinic for IOF Controllers of MTB orienteering events was staged. During the World Cup round in Veszprem, Hungary, an open meeting was held with the aim of discussing, with the competitors and coaches, issues related to the length of courses, riding off the trail, and other similar technical aspects.

The number of countries sending a team to the 2001 World Cup grew compared to the previous year. Twenty national teams competed for the medals in the World Cup events which, in general, were of high standard.

The first ever World MTB Orienteering Championships (MTB-WOC) will be organised in France in July 2002. By April 2002, entries from 28 countries had been received. The 2004 MTB-WOC will be held in Australia.

Ski Orienteering: Olympic inclusion the goal

The activities of the ski orienteering committee have been focussed on the Olympic project with the aim of securing the inclusion ski orienteering in the programme of the 2006 Olympic Winter Games in Turin, Italy. To support the Olympic bid, major high-quality ski orienteering events such as the 2001 Junior World Championships have been organised in Italy. In 2003, one World Cup round is scheduled to be organised in Italy.

In a period of continuous poor snow conditions in southern Europe, the committee has taken measures to assure that adequate competitions are organised in this region. Equally, the committee has supported the promotional campaign initiated by Council, and encouraged the national federations to approach their respective National Olympic Committees with the aim of obtaining their support for the Olympic bid.

One of the goals of the committee has been to improve the quality of major events and organisers have been encouraged to concentrate on the most important aspects of a successful event. New event concepts such as sprint distance and mass start events have been introduced and developed. Further development is still needed, in particular in relation to efforts to make the sport more interesting for spectators and more visible in the press and on TV, and particularly on the Internet, thus making it more interesting for sponsors.

Whilst it is crucial to maintain sporting fairness, improved visibility is also of utmost importance. This can be achieved even if well known and centrally located arenas and terrains are used for events, providing that certain measures are taken such as adequate track making and course setting, limitations in time for competitors that may know the terrain, and appropriately organised access to the terrain for all competitors prior to the events. These ideas have been tested over the past two years but will need further development, including adjustments to rules and guidelines.

Last season, World Ranking Events (WRE) in ski orienteering were successfully introduced and managed, both in terms of establishing guidelines and event programme, organising and controlling of the events, and the continuous results service on the IOF web site, including the updating of the ranking list. Improvements to the guidelines and result reporting will be proposed for the next season. The WRE scheme will be further developed to provide an adequate event programme as a supplement to major IOF events. In addition, the WRE concept may provide opportunities for up and coming athletes, for developing and testing new competition concepts, and for organisers to develop their skills in preparation for major events.


The Elite Event Programme approved for foot orienteering has been discussed within the committee. The future event programme can only be finalised after the decision regarding the application for the inclusion of ski orienteering in the programme of the Olympics is known. Should the bid not be successful, the committee would suggest an event programme primarily as per today, with improved activity to promote the sport within this programme, the further development of WRE events, and the provision of assistance to new organisers, with a view to contributing to the successful development of the sport.

Trail Orienteering: towards a World Championship

Following the successful 2000 World Cup competitions, a two day World Cup competition was organised by the Finnish Orienteering Federation as part of the activities associated with the World Orienteering Championships in Tampere. The Open competition attracted competitors from 14 nations, with 9 nations competing in the Paralympic class.

The second Controllers' Clinic was organised in conjunction with the competition. The clinic was attended by 30 delegates some of whom are now registered as IOF Event Advisors.

During the Congress period, an introductory leaflet was produced and offered to the national federations for translation. Twenty-two nations took up the offer of receiving a CD-ROM. The leaflet was also distributed to the delegates at the International Paralympic Committee's (IPC) Development Congress in Kuala Lumpur which was attended by Anne Braggins and Taro Koyama.

Updated rules that will apply to all IOF trail orienteering competitions, including a future World Championship, have been prepared for publication.

Information and results of IOF trail orienteering events and some links referring to trail orienteering activities of the national federations are made available on the trailo.org site which can be accessed direct or via the IOF Internet homepage.

Orienteering - the Environmental Sport

The Environmental Commission continues to fulfil its basic duties as laid down in its Terms of Reference. However, during the Congress period, two very important developments commanded the commission's attention.

The first was the World Orienteering Championships (WOC) 2001 at Tampere, Finland. Aware that orienteering has good environmental credentials, the organisers decided that WOC 2001 would be the most environmentally friendly major sports event of the year.

For all aspects of the event, environmental targets were set similar to those seen at the Olympic Games. In addition to the critical target of minimal environmental impact on the flora and fauna in the competition area, a number of other targets were set for reduction of material and energy consumption, recycling waste, edu-

cating and influencing participants, goods suppliers and the public.

An environmental audit of performance related to these targets was conducted by an audit panel from WWF, the Finnish Environmental Institute and the IOF Environmental Commission. The panel concluded that, although the target for transportation had not been met, the overall performance, particularly in the competition terrain, had been a success and it was probable that the organisers had indeed staged 'the most environmentally-friendly major sports event of the year'.

The second development was an invitation to the IOF to attend the Fourth IOC World Conference on Sport and the Environment at Nagano, Japan, in November 2001. The Environmental Commission Chair Brian Parker represented the IOF and made a short presentation entitled 'Orienteering - the Environmental Sport'.

The objectives of the presentation were to acquaint the IOC Sport & Environment Commission and the conference delegates with the nature of orienteering, to explain how orienteering conducts itself in achieving its impressive status as an environmentally-sensitive sport, to claim that the WOC 2001 in Finland was the most environmentally-friendly major sporting event of the year and to challenge other sports to match or beat that, and to indicate, in passing, that orienteering has Olympic aspirations. All these objectives were met.

Two important statements about orienteering and the environment were presented to the Conference and to the world of sport at large. These were: Orienteering encourages those who participate to build up a personal relationship with Nature and thereby become more responsi-

ble in taking care of it, and Orienteering shows that it is possible to conduct a mass participation sport in the natural environment in a sensitive and sustainable way, particularly with the understanding and co-operation of respected environmental organisations.

Information Technology: the Interface Standards Project

The IT Commission has continued the work that it inherited from the former Technology Development Committee: to promote the use of advanced internet technology within the orienteering community.

One important element in this work is the Interface Standards project, the idea behind which is to create a specification of standard data formats. The existence of such standard data formats facilitates the sharing and exchange of information among the various software systems used when organising an orienteering event, thus simplifying the arduous task of the organiser and simultaneously enabling new possibilities.

The dedicated work of a small group of people on the Interface Standards project - in co-operation with the Swedish Orienteering Federation (SOFT) - took the standard successfully forward to a version 2.0, published early 2002. With version 2, the standard data formats have gained acceptance. They already form part of the fundamental concept in SOFT's software package, "OLA", and they are currently being implemented into software from Emit and SportIdent, as well as other prominent software packages.

The advent of electronic punching, a few years ago, brought about an element of standardisation with regard to event administration software. The progress in the use of the standard data formats is promising in terms of the further integration of internet applications into the organisation of events. The use of the formats enable the use of standard web services that can be developed independently of the event administration software used.

On request from the Elite Events Group, the IT Commission helped provide real-time internet results coverage from World Games 2001 in Japan. Subsequently, possibilities for creating a common internet presence for the World Cup series in 2002 are being pursued, in order to market the series of events in a common concept. This has proven to be a very complex project that requires support from many different parties.

Mapping: sprint specifications and clinics

During the congress period 2000-2002, the work of the Map Commission has been largely concentrated on the creation of drawing specifications for the new discipline format, sprint orienteering. The commission worked in close co-operation with the Foot Orienteering Committee (FOC) and the IOF Elite Events Group (EEG). The Map Commission developed a document listing the problems and possible solutions in mapping urban terrain in large scale. This was the basis for an intensive discussion together with the EEG and led to some principles regarding how to organise and use the terrain for sprint events, e.g. not to make three-dimensional maps.

Knowing these principles, the commission elaborated a proposal for drawing specifications for sprint orienteering. A decision will be taken in July 2002 and it is intended to publish the specifications in autumn 2002.

The tradition of organising an international clinic for map makers (ICOM) in conjunction with the World Orienteering Championships was continued. The 9th ICOM took place in Tampere in August 2001 with 18 participants from 12 countries. The topics were "Map generalisation guidelines and map generalisation in practice", "Sprint orienteering map specification", "ISOM2000, past, present...", "Mapping with PC", and "WOC 2001 mapping project".

Two map clinics were organised in autumn 2001. The clinic in Nagoya, Japan, attracted 27 participants, and the clinic in Beijing, China, gathered 17 map makers. The last day in Japan was a closed session for the WOC 2005 mapmakers. Both clinics proved to be very successful and a good investment in improving the map quality for future international events in these IOF member federations.

Rules: initiatives in all disciplines

The IOF Rules Commission has taken over much of the work of the IOF Event Standards Committee which held its last meeting in October 2000. It was not until a year later that the tasks for the new Rules Commission were defined and the Chair was formally appointed, and only in February 2002 was a second member appointed. In the interim, the work of the Rules Commission was necessarily limited to the most pressing tasks.

In the autumn of 2000, an IOF Foot Orienteering Controllers' Clinic was held in POR. In 2001 successful IOF Foot Orienteering Controllers' Clinics were run in JPN and in UKR, and the first IOF MTB Orienteering Controllers' Clinic was con-

ducted in FRA. A Trail Orienteering Controllers' Clinic was held in conjunction with WOC in FIN. A further Foot Orienteering Clinic will be held in CZE in 2002. The title of IOF Controller has been replaced by IOF Event Advisor to more accurately reflect the role. There are now 160 Foot Orienteering Event Advisors, 20 Ski Orienteering Event Advisors, 4 MTB Orienteering Event Advisors and 12 Trail Orienteering Event Advisors. The concept of Senior Event Advisor has been developed but not yet formally put into practice.

The Rules Commission has worked closely with the MTB Orienteering Committee to publish the first set of MTB Orienteering Rules, and with the Trail Orienteering Committee to draft the Trail Orienteering Rules. In addition, there has been co-operation with the Ski Orienteering Committee to revise the Ski Orienteering Rules.

The Rules Commission has worked closely with the Foot Orienteering Committee on Special Rules for the World Cup and World Championships.

There has been close co-operation with the MTB Orienteering Committee in preparation for the first World MTB Orienteering Championships in 2002.

The IOF Control Descriptions have been revised and a final draft has been prepared for consultation.

The Rules Commission has been able to act as an advisory body in cases where jury decisions have been questioned, but the question of whether there should be a right of appeal against jury decisions is still being considered.






Percentage of member federations recognised by
