


President's Preface

We have over the last decade worked hard to develop our sport in order to make it more attractive to all – to current participants, to new recruits, to spectators and to media and sponsors. During the last Congress period, the IOF Council has focussed on addressing the development needs that have emerged as our sport is assessed against criteria widely used in international sports circles to describe what constitutes a successful sport.

Initiatives include the development of both concepts and tools for realising professional arena production. Together with member federations, we have worked earnestly in developing our contacts with TV broadcasters and broadcasting networks. The intentions have been to have our main events more frequently covered and to reach a wider audience. We have made significant progress. The launching in 2007 of a new World Cup in foot orienteering will provide a good opportunity to witness the results of these efforts.

We have discussed, sometimes intensively, how to find ways to make orienteering even more attractive to spectators and to viewers following our events via the media, in particular TV. The Micr-O concept that was to be introduced at this year's World Championships in foot orienteering will most probably get new opportunities in future events. We also have to realise, and accept, that we must continue to try to find more ways to make an orienteering event easy to follow, and above all, thrilling to watch on TV.

With today's level of technology we can follow athletes' routes in the forest but we still need more ways to show the 'soul' of our sport to create the kind of sport entertainment that most TV sports, today, bring to their spectators. There is no doubt that this constitutes a major challenge, but is also a necessity to better position our sport for inclusion in the Olympic Games in the future and to safeguard our present inclusion in other multi-sport games.



The continued spread of orienteering to new countries and the staging of our most prestigious events around the world will remain important tasks for the IOF and its member federations. The intense competition for a limited number of slots in multi-sport games makes it an absolute necessity that we are regarded as a truly worldwide sport. Over the next few years we need to continue to strengthen our sport on all continents and in particular in regions where the sport is still in the early stages of development. The gradually emerging regional structure will play an increasingly important role in driving and supporting the spread of our sport and in raising levels of activity in all parts of the globe.

May I thank everyone working in the IOF and in all countries for your dedicated contribution to our sport's development – your efforts make the difference!

Council's Report

The long term and continuing goals of the IOF are the further spread of orienteering to more people throughout the world and the creation of tight, top level competitions between athletes from many nations worldwide.

Continued global development was one of the main themes of the IOF Congress held at Västerås, Sweden, in September 2004. The General Assembly urged the IOF to continue to work for further geographical spread of the sport, to support regional development, and to ensure a worldwide elite events programme.

An important route to securing global development is to raise the profile of orienteering by staging high quality, highly visible, events around the world, and by taking part in international multi-sports games. The activity plan endorsed by the XXII IOF Ordinary General Assembly held on 14 September 2004 therefore included three main objectives for the Congress period 2004 – 2006, namely, strengthening the IOF and its members in order to better promote the sport, improving the total quality of major events and developing all four disciplines.

Significant increase in membership

As of 30 April 2006, the IOF has 67 member countries of which 48 are full, and 19 associate members.

The total membership has increased by almost 50 % over the last decade - a remarkable achievement in a short period of time. The rapid development in Asia and in South and Central America has been particularly pleasing but it is also encouraging that the IOF has now gained two new member federations in Africa, where South Africa for many years was the only member.


Since the 2004 Congress, Council has provisionally approved applications for membership from four new countries, namely Mongolia (full membership), Georgia, Kenya and Somalia (associate membership).

In August 2005, Council provisionally approved an application for full membership from the former associate member the Amateur Orienteering Association of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea.

More countries have announced readiness to apply for membership, and regional co-operation is also progressing rapidly on all continents. Co-operation between the members within each region is further strengthening both geographical spread and the level of development within each member federation.

Governance and management

For the purpose of deciding on the revision of the IOF Statutes, an Extraordinary General Assembly



was held on 14 September 2004, prior to the XXII IOF Ordinary General Assembly. The Statutes were amended in the interests of clarity, to reflect the current aims and obligations of the IOF, and to meet the requirements of organisations such as the International Olympic Committee and the World Anti-Doping Agency.

The XXII General Assembly witnessed a change of IOF President as Sue Harvey, President since 1994, did not stand for re-election. The former Senior Vice President, Åke Jacobson, was elected IOF President. Sue Harvey was appointed Honorary President for Life, and was also presented with the IOF Gold Pin.

Czech Republic and Hungary were appointed organisers of the 2008 and 2009 World Orienteering Championships and World Trail Orienteering Championships, and the 2007 World Ski Orienteering Championships were awarded to Russia.

The Presidents' Conference convened in conjunction with the World Orienteering Championships. The meeting took place on 13 August 2005 in Toyota City, Aichi Prefecture, Japan. The agenda included several topics such as the future elite events programme in foot orienteering, IOF finances, the World Games, and the appointment of organisers of World Championships. Representatives of 25 member federations attended the meeting.

During the past Congress period, the IOF Council has convened seven times. The meetings have been held in Västerås, Sweden; Toyota City, Aichi Prefecture, Japan; Helsinki, Finland (4 meetings) and Aarhus, Denmark. Council has also held eight meetings by means of electronic communication. The decisions taken by e-mail have been noted in, and regarded as part of, the minutes of the following Council meeting.

The basic organisational structure established in 2000 has been maintained. Each of the four discipline commissions, i.e. the Foot Orienteering Commission, the Mountain Bike Orienteering Commission, the Ski Orienteering Commission, and the Trail Orienteering Commission, has been responsible for the implementation of all activities related to its respective discipline. The support commissions, namely the Development and Policy Commission, Environment Commission, IT Commission, Map Commission, Medical

Commission and Rules Commission have served as a source of expertise for the discipline commissions and for Council.

Following the 2004 General Assembly, the Council decided on a new working model. Four policy areas, namely Foreign Affairs, Finance and Fundraising, Regional Development and Planning were established. In addition, acknowledging the need to ensure the further development of mountain bike orienteering, ski orienteering and trail orienteering, Council decided to establish a special project for each of these disciplines.

The goal of securing significant income from sponsorship has continued to be a challenge, as it is for most international sporting federations. Council has developed a plan aimed at securing increased income from external sources in future years. A fundraising strategy designed to enable the IOF to create more professional resources was presented to the Presidents' Conference in Japan and, with the support of member federations, this will lead to a strengthening of the IOF's capacity to realise its key goals and vision.


IOF regions established

In keeping with the General Assembly decision taken in 2002, the Council proposed to the 2004 General Assembly that the regional structure be defined and IOF regions established. It was determined that the regions should basically follow the IOC (continental) division of regions. However, for the purpose of development and the current objectives and needs of the IOF and its members, six IOF regions were established, namely Africa, North America, South America, Asia, Europe and Oceania. The countries of Central America are free to associate with the region of choice. The regional structure is meant to be informal and a set of model working rules for co-operation between the federations in a region has been prepared by the Council.

The IOF regional structure has been created for two major reasons: to assist the development of orienteering within the regions, and with a view to, in the future, having biennial regional orienteering championships in each of the six regions.

The overall objective of regional orienteering championships is to enhance the development of

worldwide elite events that reflect regional needs and correspond to the stage of development of a region. Therefore, the format of each Regional Championship may differ. The regional championships may, in future, be included in the elite events programme in foot orienteering.

World Championships in Japan an historic occasion

The 2005 World Orienteering Championships in Foot Orienteering in Japan was an historic occasion. For the first time in the history of international orienteering, the World Championships were held in Asia. This means that this premier event has now been staged on four continents, marking the worldwide spread of the sport over the last two decades.

The number of nations present in Japan was similar to the number of nations who competed in the championships in Sweden in 2004. Athletes from 17 nations were represented among the 16 best in the four men's competitions, and 14 nations were represented among the 16 best in the women's competitions, with runners from 3 continents among these 16 best placed. Nations from Asia, Oceania and

North America such as China, Japan, Australia, New Zealand and Canada recorded their best ever performances at a World Orienteering Championship.

More is to come. For the first time, the Junior World Championships in Foot Orienteering will be held outside Europe in 2007 (Oceania), as will the World Championships in Ski Orienteering in 2009 (Asia). Add to this the fact that the 2004 World Championships in MTB Orienteering were held in Australia and it becomes clearly evident that orienteering has taken a significant step forward in becoming a truly world wide sport.

New World Cup concept from 2007

In August 2003, the IOF Council set up an Events Programme Group (EPG) to review the future of the world elite events programme in foot orienteering. The group consulted widely and secured input from 29 member federations and runners and coaches representing 23 nations. The final report detailed a number of recommendations, including placing considerable weight on further developing the concept of regional championships. On the basis of this report, Council prepared a proposal for a new elite events

programme to the XXII IOF Ordinary General Assembly in Västerås, Sweden.

The main focus of the Foot Orienteering Commission (FOC) has been planning for the introduction of the new elite events programme. The Foot Orienteering Commission conducted surveys, held open meetings and made presentations at the World Orienteering Championships to realise a programme that satisfies both competitive and development needs. The final proposal was presented to Council in the latter part of 2005 and the new World Cup programme for 2007 was announced at the beginning of March 2006.

The new World Cup shall be part of achieving the IOF's goals, in particular the Olympic goal. It is designed to be attractive to runners, media, spectators and sponsors. It shall contribute to making orienteering more visible and it shall aim for a worldwide perspective.

The 2007 World Cup programme will include 10 races and is based on the World Orienteering Championships in Ukraine, and on a number of races held as part of already existing, high-quality events in Finland, Norway, Sweden and Switzerland. The World Cup programme for 2008 and 2009 will be finalised and published by 30 June and 31 December 2006 respectively.

It is envisaged that the programme will assume a greater regional and world perspective in future years. The Foot Orienteering Commission has encouraged new event formats in the programme and has also supported the Micr-O concept.

Arena production for quality presentation of major events

Arena production is a term used to define a set of tools and services for quality presentation of major IOF events to spectators, TV, radio and Internet viewers/listeners and news media. The purpose is to provide an exciting presentation of what is going on in the forest during an event to all those following the event live, and to produce relevant information for later dissemination through news media.

Arena production is relevant to all IOF disciplines although not all of them are able to adopt the

full-scale concept. Nor is it possible for every organiser within the same discipline to meet all the expectations. In order to display all IOF events in a similar way, Council decided that, as a first step, a number of different levels of the arena production concept should be defined, and that these levels would be described in a manual. Council established an Arena Production Group for the purpose of producing the manual and proposing working models for financing the arena production concept. The first stage of the work will be finalised by the 2006 World Orienteering Championships.

The Swedish Orienteering Federation has offered to assist the IOF with the funding of the Arena Production project, and the Norwegian Orienteering Federation has declared its willingness to assist with the TV aspects of the project.


Continuous contact with Senior Event Advisers

Event quality continues to be a key element of the Foot Orienteering Commission's endeavours. Initiatives have been taken to maintain continuous contact with Senior Event Advisers and individual commission members have been given specific areas of responsibility. A very successful Senior Advisers' education seminar was held in Västerås, Sweden, in 2004, with some sixty delegates from twenty-two nations represented at the conference. The appeal of the sport to TV audiences, media and spectators is an issue that has received a great deal of attention. The Foot Orienteering Commission and the Arena Production Group have successfully liaised as initiatives are implemented to secure the visibility and capture the excitement of orienteering.

There has been close co-operation with the Rules Commission and the experiences of Senior Event Advisers have assisted in ensuring that rules evolve harmoniously. The Guidelines for both World Ranking Events and the World Masters Orienteering Championships have been updated in 2005 and the process of updating the principles of the world ranking system has begun.

Another important initiative in the Foot Orienteering Commission strategy has been to pursue and promote maximum world participation at major IOF events. The World Cup Rules for 2005

and 2006 were revised with this objective in mind. The resulting success in 2005 augurs well for the 2006 competition. The sprint format is scheduled to appear on the Junior World Orienteering Championships programme in 2006.

Major revision of foot orienteering rules

The ongoing work of the Rules Commission (RC) includes reviewing requests from commissions for rule changes. The Competition Rules for IOF Trail Orienteering Events were revised and the new rules became effective in January 2006. A major revision of the foot orienteering rules is underway and the new rules will become effective from 1st January 2007.

Foot orienteering event advisers' clinics were held in Croatia and Portugal. Ski orienteering clinics were held in Switzerland and Finland and a trail orienteering clinic was held in Japan.

The Rules Commission has continued to appoint the jury members for the major IOF events in all disciplines.

During the past months the work of the Information Technology Commission (ITC) has focused on studying punching systems, in particular the Emit Touch Free system. So far, the system has mainly been used at minor events and it is felt that more testing with large numbers of runners is required in order to evaluate the robustness of the system. Emit has been asked to conduct further tests and


to provide more detailed reports.

New ski orienteering formats further the Olympic goal

The Ski Orienteering Commission (SOC) continues to work towards inclusion of ski orienteering in the Olympic Winter Games. A key element in the strategy is to ensure that all nations with suitable climatic conditions practise the discipline. The decision to stage the World Championships in Ski Orienteering in Japan in 2009 has been welcomed. It has been viewed by the Ski Orienteering Commission as an unquestionable opportunity to develop the sport in Asia. Objectives have been determined and proposals for action outlined. It has been decided that the current event structure – World Championships in odd years and World Cup in even years – should be retained.

The Ski Orienteering Commission has requested Council to react to a number of propositions regarding the introduction of new event formats. In particular, it has asked for some indication as to whether the commission should concentrate on further developing current formats or whether other formats, possibly more suitable to present winter and equipment conditions, should be pursued.

In September 2004, the IOF Council set up the Ski Orienteering Working Group to review the current situation of ski orienteering in IOF member countries and to gather ideas for the future of world



events in ski orienteering. The group was required to consult with the ski orienteering community worldwide and with the Ski Orienteering Commission.

The working group developed a questionnaire that was distributed to all IOF member federations in November 2004, and a similar questionnaire was circulated to a reference group consisting of athletes and coaches.

The group identified three main objectives for ski orienteering, namely, to raise the profile of, and increase participation in the World Ski Orienteering Championships, to develop new formats of ski orienteering and to attract members to organise World Championships and World Cup events. The group also put forward a number of recommendations as to how to achieve these objectives. In order to realise the recommendations, the group proposed to the Council that the Ski Orienteering Commission be reorganised to respond to the requirements, and that an IOF project group be established to develop a new competition format.

With a view to assisting the IOF with the development of ski orienteering, the Finnish Orienteering Federation set up a working group and the report on the work completed was submitted to the Council in April 2006.

Development potential in Asia

The format of the European Ski Orienteering Championships and the European Youth Ski Orienteering Championships has been established and other regional championships will be considered in the light of potential development in Asia as the 2009 World Championships in Japan materialises.

The Ski Orienteering Commission has identified the need for more Senior Event Advisers. Following the conduct of ski orienteering education seminars in 2005, the Ski Orienteering Commission has decided that, together with the Rules Commission, it will evaluate such seminars.

Rules revision has been undertaken on a continuous basis, with the current review to be completed mid 2006. Guidelines for the organisation of Ski Orienteering Events is being compiled at present, while current map specifications are seen as appropriate. World Ranking Event Rules for 2006 have been decided and have been posted on the web site.

Trail orienteering at major events

In light of the inaugural World Trail Orienteering Championships held in Västerås, Sweden, in September 2004, and with a view to furthering the goal of having trail orienteering included in the Paralympic programme, the Council determined

that, in addition to the present form of trail orienteering, a physically demanding form of the discipline be developed for people with disabilities.

A reference group with the task of developing a new form of trail orienteering was established and it was determined that the new form should exhibit the following characteristics: physically demanding, technically challenging, attractive to the young generation, exciting to spectators, in keeping with the Leibnitz Convention, and be a timed event.

The results of a survey aimed at investigating the interest in, and market for, an athletic form of trail orienteering for people with disabilities, however, indicated that there would seem to be little interest in such a format. Considering the outcome of the survey, the Council agreed not to continue with the project but determined that the issue of developing trail orienteering would continue to be addressed. The members of the reference group were released from their task in January 2006.

The Trail Orienteering Commission (TOC) is currently developing a shorter event format, able to be staged in proximity to town centres and potentially interesting to TV.

A key element in the Trail Orienteering Commission development strategy is to spread the discipline to more countries; thereby increasing the number nations represented at World Cham-

pionships and other IOF events. The commission has, throughout the Congress period, continued to seek opportunities to present the discipline at major events such as the World Masters Orienteering Championships.

The education of Event Advisers has been a priority. There are some twenty accredited advisers on the list. A trail orienteering seminar in Japan at the World Orienteering Championships attracted thirty-nine participants including a significant number of Event Advisers wishing to ensure the currency of their knowledge and expertise. All seminar material, together with Advice for Organisers and Planners, has been made available on the IOF web site as a means of providing the basis for the conduct of courses by member federations.

Minor clarifications to the rules have been completed and the rules have been approved for implementation in 2006. Mapping will be the subject of review in 2006.

A discipline in rapid development

The MTB Orienteering Commission (MTBOC) has continued to carefully consider the nature of the elite programme. Current discussion focuses on long term planning of the programme. World Championship organisers have been appointed up until the year 2008 and the organisers for 2009 and 2010 will be appointed in 2006. Considerable interest has been shown for the year 2009 and beyond.

A World Ranking System for the discipline has been finalised and introduced in 2006. The World MTB Orienteering Championships in 2007 will include the sprint format. The commission has commenced a watching brief as format trials are conducted in a number of countries.

The Commission has placed significant emphasis on ensuring event quality. Initiatives are underway to secure increased opportunities for the training of Event Advisers. There is a recognised need for education seminars. The expertise of the Rules Commission is being sourced in this undertaking. The MTB Orienteering Commission is also in the process of preparing specific event guidelines for the discipline that will be published in 2006. Changes to mapping standards have been negotiated with the Map Commission and junior age class rules have been harmonised with the foot orienteering rules.

The European MTB Orienteering Championships are being held annually until 2008. An evaluation of this regional championship will provide valuable information to the commission as regional championships emerge in other areas of the world. In fact, the Congress period began with the staging of the second World MTB Orienteering Championships in Oceania. Twenty-six nations from four regions vied for supremacy. The event was testament to the feasibility of the IOF's goal of regional structures and worldwide development.

IOF secures positions in the Olympic Movement


The IOF is a recognised federation of the International Olympic Committee (IOC), a member of General Association of International Sports Federations (GAISF), Association of IOC Recognised International Sports Federations (ARISF), International World Games Association (IWGA), International Masters Games Association (IMGA), and European Masters Sports Association (EMSA).

With the aim of raising the profile of orienteering, and the IOF, in international sporting circles, the IOF has systematically sought opportunities to have people elected to key positions in sports organisations within the Olympic Movement.


In her capacity as IOF Honorary President, Sue Harvey continues to work within the international sports world. In October 2005, she was re-elected Vice President of the EMSA. At the Annual General Meeting of the IWGA held in April 2006, she was elected Vice President of the IWGA and, at the IMGA General Assembly, she was re-elected member of the IMGA Board of Governors, a position she has held since 1995.

In April 2005, IOF Secretary General Barbro Rönberg was elected Secretary General and Treasurer of the ARISF.

During the Congress period 2004 – 2006, IOF representatives have participated in international conferences and seminars, such as the yearly SportAccord Conference, the GAISF General Assembly, the IOC World Conference on Sport and the Environment, and in meetings of the IWGA, the IMGA, the EMSA, the ARISF and the Association of Summer Olympic International Federations (ASOIF).

The IOF was offered the opportunity to make a presentation on orienteering at the World Summit Conference on Sport and Tourism held in Monte Carlo, Monaco, in September 2005. The presentation was delivered by Council member Jan-Erik Krusberg, who is responsible for the Foreign Affairs policy area.

Good co-operation exists between the IOF and the International University Sports Federation (FISU) and the International Military Sports Council (CISM), and IOF representatives have been invited to, and attended, the World University Orienteering Championships and the World Military Orienteering Championships.

Review of the Olympic Winter Games programme

In November 2005, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) communicated its decision not to admit ski orienteering into the programme of the 2010 Olympic Winter Games in Vancouver, Canada. The decision was taken at the IOC Executive Board meeting in Lausanne on 26–28 October.

Although the decision was disappointing, it was not entirely unexpected. The IOC Executive Board had, on several occasions, stated that a review of the programme of the Winter Olympic Games would be conducted following the 2006 Winter Games, and that the outcome of this review would determine the programme of the 2014 Games. Hence, the IOC was not likely to make any changes to the 2010 programme.

In January 2006, the IOC confirmed that ski orienteering had been included in the review of the programme of the 2014 Olympic Winter Games and the IOF received the preliminary questionnaire which was sent to selected IOC recognised federations. The Olympic Programme Commission will make an analysis of the responses and, on the basis of the result, determine if ski orienteering has the specified characteristics required for inclusion in the further review.

The decision on the host city of the 2014 Olympic Winter Games and the sports to be included in the programme will be taken at the 119th IOC Session in Guatemala City in July 2007.

Spectacular World Games in Duisburg

The IOF was invited to participate in the 7th World Games held in Duisburg, Germany, in July 2005. The orienteering programme included an individual middle distance event for 40 men and 40 women, and a mixed team relay for teams of 2 men and 2 women. The two events held in the newly built Jahnstadion in Bottrop provided an

excellent opportunity to showcase orienteering and feature the world's best orienteers in action. The World Games also provided the athletes with the opportunity to feel the very special atmosphere of a big, well-organised multi-sports event.

At the Presidents' Conference held in conjunction with the 2005 World Orienteering Championships in Japan, the member federations declared unanimous support for continued participation in the World Games, a commitment that culminated in the so called Aichi Resolution. The resolution provides the IOF with a clear statement expressing continued co-operation with the International World Games Association and commitment to the ideals and rules of the World Games.

The next World Games will be held in Kaohsiung, Chinese Taipei, in 2009. The IOF's ambition is to include a third event on the programme. A sprint event, in addition to the middle distance and the mixed relay will fit very well into the World Games context and will provide the athletes with another competition opportunity.

More than 21,000 master athletes from 89 countries participated in the World Masters Games in Edmonton, Canada in July 2005. Together with 26 other sports, orienteering appeared on the programme of these Games. In terms of the number of competitors, with team sports included, orienteering ranked 10th. The World Masters Orienteering Championships were organised as part of the World Masters Games by the Alberta Orienteering

Association on behalf of the Canadian Orienteering Federation and the IOF.

Educational activities appreciated and in demand

As a basis for further development initiatives and activities, the IOF Development and Policy Commission has collected activity data from the federations. In general, the current development tools would appear to be appropriate. Conducting conferences and seminars is seen as a good way of helping less developed orienteering nations, and the responses indicated that it might be worthwhile to consider the introduction of seminars focussing on the education of coaches. Several new countries are currently showing an interest in the development of orienteering.

Educational seminars on topics such as mapping and event advising have been organised. The most recent seminars organised or supported by the IOF were conducted in Panama, in Kenya and in Chile. The IOF also supported a seminar for Latin American countries in Spain. In Africa, development is strongly linked to the support provided by the South African Orienteering Federation.


The IOF has also been involved in the development of the O-Ringen Academy (previously known as O-Ringen Clinics). In 2005, particular focus was placed on attracting participants from Turkey, Chinese Taipei and from South America. Some 30 participants from nine countries attended the Academy.

Orienteering not ecologically damaging

During the past Congress period, the Environment Commission (ENVC) has issued several reports, the latest one of which is the IOF/Env/002 *Review of Research into the Ecological Impact of Orienteering*. A number of studies have been carried out and this report critically reviews all studies that were of sufficient merit to make a useful contribution. This review is believed to be the first in which all the studies have been brought together and rigorously examined.

The studies show that the impact on vegetation is non-damaging, provided normal precautions are followed for sensitive sites, such as marshes and lichens. The impact on large mammals, such as elk and deer, is non-damaging, provided normal precautions such as safety zones and driving are followed. The impact on breeding birds is incompletely known. However, two careful studies of the impact of orienteering on over 50 species show zero effect. This result cannot be extended to all species, all weather and all sites. Further research is very necessary but such research is extremely difficult to carry out.

The commission has also been working to maintain charter and guidelines for environmentally friendly conduct of orienteering events, to liaise with environmental sports organisations and act

as a reference point for member federations in relation to environment.

The Chairman of the Environment Commission represented the IOF at the IOC and UN World Conference on Sport and the Environment in Nairobi in November 2005.

The sport continues to be clean

In 2004 and 2005, a total of 142 in-competition tests were conducted at major IOF events in foot orienteering, MTB orienteering and ski orienteering. All results have been negative.

The inaugural Drug Testing Service Agreement signed with the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) in the year 2003 expired in 2005, and a new three-year agreement for the period 2006–2008 has been signed. In 2004 and 2005, WADA conducted 19 out-of-competition tests. According to the summary reports issued by WADA, no adverse analytical findings or other anti-doping rule violations occurred.

The IOF has an excellent relationship with WADA and orienteering has been commended on its efficient management of athletes' whereabouts information and testing.

The Medical Commission (MEDC) has continued to be responsible for advising the IOF Council

on all matters covered by the IOF Anti-Doping Rules and on other issues in the field of doping in sport.

In accordance with the requirements of the World Anti-Doping Code, the IOF has appointed a Therapeutic Use Exemption Committee of physicians to consider requests for therapeutic use exemptions (TUEs).

The Anti-Doping Controller has been present at events where doping control has been conducted by, or on behalf of, the IOF.

PrintTech project progresses

The 11th International Conference for Orienteering Mapping (ICOM) was held in Toyota City, Japan, in conjunction with the 2005 World Orienteering Championships. The conference was attended by 40 individuals representing 7 countries. During the conference, the Map Commission (MC) also organised a successful map exhibition on the theme "Steep terrains".

In October 2002, the Map Commission started a continuous project "PrintTech" to monitor digital colour printing technologies. The first step was to collect, and complete technical information


about, sample maps. The Map Commission has now created a test sheet printed by using spot colour offset printing. The member federations are now asked to distribute the test sheets to map makers and printing firms so that they can test the quality of their printers. In order to go forward, the Map Commission needs feedback from the users of non-offset printing technology and, for this purpose, a technical report form has been distributed with the test sheet.

The commission has assisted national federations in translating the sprint orienteering map specification (ISSOM) into their own languages by making available the original graphic file and providing advice when required.

More TV coverage on the horizon

The IOF has continued its efforts to secure broadcasts from major orienteering events and, during the past twelve months, significant progress has been achieved. It is expected that, from 2007, TV coverage from main world events will be produced and transmitted more frequently than in the past, thereby raising the profile of the sport and assisting in attracting commercial partners. To a similar end, the IOF has made major changes to its website.

News releases have been issued and, in addition to having been published on the IOF website, were circulated to external media and international multi-sports organisations.

The electronic newsletter O-zine was launched in March 2001 and has proved to be a good vehicle for communication with all members of the international orienteering family. O-zine is published on the IOF Internet home page four times a year.

Since 1999, the Orienteering World magazine has been used as a PR tool with the aim of raising the profile of orienteering in the international sports world.

The theme of the 2004 edition of Orienteering World was orienteering as an elite sport, and the 2005 edition of the magazine focussed on orienteering development. The magazine has been well received within the Olympic Movement.
